NYWICI's mission is to cultivate leaders in communications through financial support, professional development, mentoring and networking.

## **Events and Major Committee Initiatives:**

November – Annual Student Career Conference (November 10, 2018 at NYU). This daylong conference features keynotes from some of the most notable names in communication and panels and workshops on broadcast, editorial, public relations, fashion, food, travel, personal branding, resumes, interviews and more. Past keynotes include Anne Fulenwider, Editor-in-Chief of Marie Claire; Eva Chen, head of Fashion Partnerships at Instagram; Reshma Saujani, founder of Girls Who Code; TODAY anchor Hoda Kotb; and Bonnie Fuller, former American Media EVP and chief editorial director.

**April – Annual Matrix Awards Luncheon (April 22, 2018)**. The committee is not involved in Matrix planning, although some committee members participate day-of as hosts/mentors to the scholars.

**July – Annual Ladies Who Laugh Comedy Show**. This fundraiser was created by students and provides funds for a scholarship. It is a great evening and has featured comedians like Amy Schumer, Rain Pryor, Rachel Feinstein, Christina Bianco, and more.

**Quarterly – Behind-the-Scenes Tours**. Designed to give members an intimate look at some of the top companies in communications, members have a chance to visit companies like Google, Mashable, Bloomberg and Alison Brod Public Relations where they can learn about the career paths of successful women at the company, the culture and how they might secure an internship or full-time job.

**TBA – A joint event with the Young Professional Committee**. Student Affairs will team up with YoPros to create an event that will provide great insight and inspiration to our members about the next steps in their careers.
